Salvation is Here

Read the Whole Text: Mark 5

Core Verses: Mark 5:24-34

A large crowd followed and pressed around him. ²⁵ And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years. ²⁶ She had suffered a great deal under the care of many doctors and had spent all she had, yet instead of getting better she grew worse. ²⁷ When she heard about Jesus, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, ²⁸ because she thought, "If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed." ²⁹ Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she was freed from her suffering.

- ³⁰ At once Jesus realized that power had gone out from him. He turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched my clothes?"
- ³¹ "You see the people crowding against you," his disciples answered, "and yet you can ask, 'Who touched me?' "
- ³² But Jesus kept looking around to see who had done it. ³³ Then the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came and fell at his feet and, trembling with fear, told him the whole truth. ³⁴ He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering."



Gospel of Mark

Genre: Greco-Roman "Gospel" narrative

Description of a person through their deeds and words, detailing their death as the final revelation of their character

Context

1st century Jewish/Roman world

Author

Strong early tradition that the author is John Mark writing in Rome around 55-65 AD. Mark is writing what he heard from Peter about the life of Jesus

Use your imagination to dig deeper into the story so that God may communicate with you in a personal, evocative way
