Read the Whole Text: Mark 11

## Core Verses: Mark 11:7-11

<sup>7</sup>When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. <sup>8</sup> Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. <sup>9</sup> Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted,

“Hosanna!”

“Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!”

<sup>10</sup> “Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!”

“Hosanna in the highest heaven!”

<sup>11</sup> Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple courts. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.

## Gospel of Mark

**Genre: Greco-Roman  
“Gospel” narrative**

Description of a person through their deeds and words, detailing their death as the final revelation of their character

### **Context**

1<sup>st</sup> century Jewish/Roman world

### **Author**

Strong early tradition that the author is John Mark writing in Rome around 55-65 AD. Mark is writing what he heard from Peter about the life of Jesus
